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I. WHY – BACKGROUND FOR THIS CALL

1.1. RATIONALE OF THE OCTOBER 2025 CALL

As every year, also in September 2025, FEPS submitted its annual grant application for 2025 – in response to the call by the European Parliament. The package that was delivered including the so-called “FAP” (Framework Activity Programme 2026, as adopted by the FEPS General Assembly in June and fine-tuned with the endorsement of the FEPS Bureau in September 2025).

The FAP 2026 remains a compass for the strategic orientation of FEPS.

It serves as reference point when it comes FEPS’ prioritization and allocation of resources for the purpose of building FEPS’ 2026 Work Plan (WP).

The main rationale of the present call is thus to translate our jointly identified objectives into concrete activities that will enter FEPS’ 2026 Work Plan (WP).

FEPS’ 2026 Work Plan will consist of 4 main building blocks:

1. Multiannual programmes and projects that are still **ongoing** (and/or have been prolonged)
2. **Annual flagship activities** that FEPS and partners have run with success for years
3. **New** projects elaborated with you **on the basis of your proposals** proposed by yourself, FEPS’ Members, in line with the FAP2026
4. The **activities** identified by FEPS on which **you are invited to collaborate on**

1.2. SCOPE OF THE OCTOBER 2025 CALL

In line with the above-mentioned rationale, the objective of the present FEPS October 2025 Call is 3-fold:

1. To gather your new project proposals
2. To gather your interest(s) in approved projects and programmes
3. To gather your non-committing ideas for new project proposals

The overall aim being to **lay down the foundations for a qualitative, relevant and impactful 2026 Work Plan.**

As it has been the case in past fall calls, the nature of submitted projects can be articulate around one or several of the following:

1. Research and studies
2. Outreach and public debates
3. Capacity Building and Training
4. Publications and Communications

Your submissions will be a key element of FEPS' Work Plan 2026 drafting process which will involve among others:

- The present call's outputs
- Exchange at the FEPS Member Foundations Meeting (29th October 2025)
- Evaluation of the submitted project proposals and recommendations of the Project Council
- Discussion within the FEPS Core Team
- Drafting of a Consolidated Work Plan 2026
- Further internal consultations and fine-tuning
- Presentation and decision on the Work Plan Draft Outline at FEPS' Bureau meeting to date January 2025

In this process, the project proposals will be carefully examined, drawing on – if applicable - the evaluation of previous partnerships.

It will also carefully examine criteria such as objectives, outputs and financial engagement, as well as the investment in working hours and human resources engagement required in a potential project on the part of FEPS.

To that end, FEPS would like to encourage you to consider filing the project proposals together and think about potential multi-stakeholder consortia.

We invite you to note that the usage of the grant from the European Parliament by FEPS is subject to specific regulatory provisions, one of them being that all activities funded or co-funded by FEPS must be genuine FEPS activities. Accordingly, FEPS is forbidden to provide grants / fund your own activities: all selected proposals will undergo a framing process.

We therefore emphasize the need to construct your proposals while thinking about the added value of such a strategic partnership with and for FEPS.

Deadline for your inputs:

21.11.2025 noon CET

A **FEPS-Members meeting** will be held on **October 29th 2025** to provide as much guidance and information as possible, gather your questions and remarks and exchange on specific areas of cooperation.

II. WHAT – THEMATIC FOCUS

2.1. FEPS' 3 2026 STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

2.1.1. For a Stronger, Strategically Autonomous and Cooperative Europe

Boosting the power and capacity of the European Union to act as an integrated Community that is committed to delivering on the promise of peace, sustainable development, prosperity and a new multilateral global deal

2.1.2. For a Recovered, Resilient and Transformative Social Europe

Paving the way to a new European development model by equipping it with policy instruments to fight inequalities and ensure wellbeing as well as social progress for all through its economic, fiscal, labour, care, social, gender, green and digital policies

2.1.3. For a Democratic and Enlarged Europe

Strengthening the Political Union through adequate institutional reforms and means, so that it can defend and promote democracy, as also empower and engage citizens in the new steps of the deliberations about the Future of Europe.

2.2. THEMATIC AREAS FOR THIS CALL FOR PROJECTS

2.2.1. EUROPE IN THE WORLD

Focusing on the EU's role in striving for peace and development in a new multipolar global order, as well as bilateral relations with strategic partners in diverse formats of alliances, partnerships and neighbourhood policies. Contributing to the development of a stronger security and defence dimension of the EU and a geoeconomic analysis of the new global reality.

With specific attention to :

- Advancing in Europe's strategic autonomy and developing a new defence and security architecture that promotes sustainable peace and human security
- Asserting Europe's role as a promoter of a rule-based multilateralism, international law and sustainable development
- Enhancing balanced EU-Africa relations
- Support Ukraine's post-war inclusive reconstruction and accession process

2.2.2. MIGRATION

Informing and sustaining a fair debate on asylum and migration, prioritising the monitoring of the Pact on Migration and Asylum's implementation and the development of integration and labour policies that actively build social cohesion; defining the features of an efficient and humane migration management; developing fair and transparent relations with the countries of origin and transit; as well as analysing the vital link between Europe's demographic challenges and migration dynamics.

With specific attention to :

- Promoting a balanced and fair dialogue on migration between Africa and the European
- Monitoring the implementation of the Pact on migration and asylum
- Focusing on the social dimension of migration and integration

2.2.3. SOCIAL EUROPE

Monitoring the implementation of the European Pillar of Social Rights, as well as the creation of the EU's Affordable Housing Plan and Anti-Poverty Strategy, ensuring the social dimension of the next Multiannual Financial Framework, and developing new ideas related to the concept of work and quality jobs as well as in the field of healthcare, wellbeing, education and provision of public services.

With specific attention to :

- Monitoring the implementation of the European Pillar of Social Rights
- Ensuring quality public services and social investment
- Reviving the EU Health Union initiative

2.2.4. ECONOMY AND FINANCE

Designing a resilient and sustainable economic development model, to forge policy proposals towards a job-rich growth through a robust European industrial policy as well as the EU fiscal capacity; advocating fair taxation to support the innovative, fair, competitive and productive economy, and scaling up economic democracy.

With specific attention to :

- Building an effective industrial policy at EU level
- The EU Multiannual Financial Framework on the socialist agenda
- Promoting economic democracy (including employee ownership)

2.2.5. CLIMATE AND ENVIRONMENT

Addressing the climate emergency and supporting the implementation of the European Green Deal, with a commitment to search for further equitable ways to reach ambitious climate and environmental goals globally, create new clean jobs and mainstream climate and ecological objectives in European policies.

With specific attention to :

- Adaptation to the impacts of climate change for all sectors and all people
- A European strategy for industrial decarbonization
- Development of green technologies: European and regional dimensions

2.2.6. DIGITAL ECONOMY AND SOCIETY

Assessing the effects of accelerated digital transformation for European societies and economies, exploring how AI impacts workers, how we keep our democracy healthy in times of social media and how Europe can create its digital model for an autonomous, progressive path towards technological development that supports public services.

With specific attention to :

- Designing a roadmap for EU digital sovereignty
- Promoting ethics in artificial intelligence (AI)
- Ensuring digitalization advances sustainability

2.2.7. GENDER EQUALITY

Strengthening the commitment to the feminist and gender equality agenda, with a focus on preventing backlash, delivering substantive equality through transformative and gender mainstreamed policies

With specific attention to :

- Promoting Gender Equality amid grand transformations – green, digital, labor-market related and demographic ones
- Forging global solidarity for women’s rights and combating gender-based violence
- Promoting Feminist Leadership for democracy

2.2.8. POLITICAL EUROPE

Examining the functioning of and potential for the reforms within the institutional architecture of the European Union, with a mission to inspire the transition to a new model of integration that will allow for further deepening and enlargement, as well as strategic partnerships such as the one with the UK

With specific attention to :

- Anticipating the reform of the EU institutional architecture and strengthening the role of the Europarties within it
- Pursuing the agenda of EU enlargement and forging the Eastern Partnership for the future
- Defining the EU strategic partnerships and special relationships

2.2.9. DEFENDING AND DEEPENING DEMOCRACY

Analysing the main threats to democracy (far right politics, authoritarian tendencies, nationalism) inside but also outside the European Union – in order to find ways to foster participatory and representative democracy, with a specific focus on young people.

With specific attention to :

- Countering the Transnational Far Right Movement
- Understanding, reconnecting and reengaging the youth
- Shielding public space from disinformation and preserving pluralism

2.2.10. FUTURE OF SOCIAL DEMOCRACY

Evaluating the positioning of the progressive forces across the levels of governance, with a focus on their programmatic and strategic dilemmas, organisational difficulties and electoral appeal, governing capacities as well as abilities to remain constructive opposition and to bounce back from the crises.

With specific attention to :

- Translating progressive values to both anticipate challenges ahead and forge a new doctrine for the European project of the future
- Defining progressive alliances amid the context of the pluralist left and political fragmentation
- Boosting the capacity of the social democratic movement through the European exchange of best practices and enabling understanding of the respective national nuances

2.2.11. CONSOLIDATING FEPS' TRAINING PROGRAMME

In January 2022 FEPS Bureau endorsed the FEPS Training Strategy (TS), following which moment it has been in the phase of implementation that saw close to 100% of accomplishment of the initial deliverables. The TS continues to evolve around 3 pillars, focused on: knowledge, skills and capacity building respectively.

While the Members responded enthusiastically and especially in 2024 there has been a high demand to work together, FEPS believes that in order to ensure the coherence of multiple instruments and financial sustainability, the TS should be transformed into a FEPS Programme.

Building on the existing elements, it will include:

- FEPS Open Progressive University
- FEPS Annual Autumn Academy
- Ones to Watch
- FEPS Young Academic Network
- FEPS and Partners Pool of Trainers
- FEPS and Partners Political Academies
- FEPS Leadership Academy
- FEPS Primers

2.2.12. FEPS CONSULTANCY

FEPS has developed a capacity to offer timely and high-quality policy consultancy to progressive policy makers in office or opposition at various stages of the policy process.

Current and past research projects, and contributions of the extensive expert network provide a solid basis for FEPS to be in a position from which it can deliver sound policy advice. FEPS intends to continue organize ad hoc topical **review meetings** to help gearing it.

2.3. PROJECT PROPOSALS AND EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST

With the present invitation to respond to the “Call for projects and Call for Expression of Interest” FEPS offers you to join forces in discussing, developing and implementing our common FEPS Work Plan 2026.

Responding to the repeated reminders about the limited resources and a need for greater coordination within the progressive family, as also the fact that we are aiming at building not just for a year, but plan for long, FEPS decided to maintain three submission categories proposed in 2025:

1. Submission of new project proposals
2. Expressions of interest in approved projects, programmes or flagships
3. Submission of non-committing ideas

Across these 3 categories, we encourage you to partner with other Members, since it allows:

- A sharper design of the project in order to more precisely meet the objectives of the different foundations involved;
- Scaling up of the ambitions and impact of the project activities;
- A possibility to ensure a truly European dimension and outreach;
- Enlarge the network of experts, allowing more of the academics and politicians from the national and regional level to take part in the European debate;
- Better sharing of the financial implications, as co-financing needs can be split among participating members.

Please kindly note that submissions within the categories 1-2 will all be evaluated alongside the same timeline with the final recommendations as per include / adjust / not include being part of the selection procedure outlined below (cf. chapter III).

Submission within the Category 3 will be treated separately – with the FEPS Director and FEPS Policy Analyst in charge of the related field initiating a contact and brainstorming meeting as the first step in response.

2.3.1. Category 1: Submission of New Project Proposals

1	Call to Europe / spring and autumn 2026 <u>Thematic Field:</u> Political Europe	At its origin, The <i>Call to Europe</i> conference (www.calltoeurope.eu) was designed to be a public event held in Brussels. Through reflection, the concept was developed: the ambition remains to use the brand for organising high-level conferences not only in Brussels, but also in the countries holding the Presidency of the EU. In 2026, FEPS is hoping to hold the events of this series in Cyprus and Ireland respectively.
2	Policy Conference <u>Thematic fields:</u> Social Europe Economy and Finance (Others possible)	At the beginning of Fall, FEPS is annually organising a Policy Conference. It serves as a space for a review of the EU policy agenda and an open door debate for the politicians, trade unions, civil society experts and academics. The event endeavors to constitute an opportunity to promote FEPS' work on the leading questions pertaining the future of the Union.
3	UNited for <u>Thematic fields:</u> Europe in the World Climate and Environment	The "UNited for" initiative rests upon an agreement with, and personal commitment of UN Secretary-General António Guterres made to FEPS on May 4th 2017. It comprises of an annual international conference, organised in New York, on the fringe of the UN General Assembly. The intention is to continue making the most effective use of the FEPS ECOSOC consultative status. In 2026 FEPS, in accordance to the annual theme defined for UNGA, "UNited for" will focus on sustainability, climate change and natural restoration.
4	12th Oxford Symposium <u>Thematic fields:</u> Future of Social Democracy Next Left	The Oxford Symposium gathers for 2 days leading politicians and senior academics from across the EU and the UK, to jointly deliberate on the most pertinent questions regarding the future of social democracy and the continent. Each of the editions has been devoted to a specific focus, resulting in a publication. There is a great anticipation on the 12th edition, which will be taking place within a year time from the present call since the EU – UK relations entered in a new era in May 2025.

5	FEPS Digital Programme <u>Thematic fields:</u> Digital Economy and Society	Since 2023, FESP has been successfully conducting a programme in cooperation, particularly with partnering organisations from the north. A new edition of FEPS' digital programme was launched for 2025-2026. While the repository of the ideas (in a form of publications, podcasts and meeting reports) remain rich, there is a strong belief that beyond the work on legislative pieces such as Digital Services Act and Digital Market Act (of which full implementation is of a strategic importance in the contemporary reality), FEPS will also strive to popularise the debate on the state and future of digital capitalism, as well as on the AI Development Act. Herewith, it raises awareness and boosts the movement's capacity to further frame and lead that process. Building a better popular understanding and hence support for the ideas connected with the new European industrial model, the need to defend the European digital sovereignty and think ahead about building own EU-regulated platforms is a central objective thereof.
6	FEPS Climate Programme <u>Thematic field:</u> Climate and Environment	The FEPS – FES Climate programme has grown to be stable, prolific and multifaceted. Here, the focal points for 2026 will include the already mentioned implementation of the Clean Industrial Deal, regional just transitions, Clean Trade and Investment Partnerships, and international climate negotiations. Filling an important gap, new research will be developed in the context of the upcoming European Climate Adaptation Plan. The issue of the just transition in the context of the Western Balkans and their accession shall also receive special attention. Last but not least, what shall be considered as an important addition, is the set of issues that connect the fight against climate change with the questions about the future of agriculture, food security and the agenda for restoration.
7	Training Programme <u>Thematic fields:</u> Training	In January 2022 FEPS Bureau endorsed the FEPS Training Strategy, following which moment it has been entering the phase of implementation. If FEPS' Training Strategy continues to evolve around 3 pillars, focused on: knowledge, skills and capacity building respectively, it remains articulated around a series of individual building blocks which aggregation and rearticulation in the form of single consistent Training Programme is FEPS' aim.
8	Visiting Fellowship Programme <u>Thematic fields:</u> Training	FEPS is committed to reinforcing its linkages with academia in order to provide valuable policy research and analysis that can instruct and inspire progressive policy-making. In 2021, FEPS launched a new Visiting Fellowship Programme to give the opportunity to PhD candidates and Post-Docs, as also the established researchers and experienced stakeholders to contribute to the strategic priorities outlined in the present Framework Activity Programme. The Visiting Fellows work on a research plan that fits with FEPS priorities and projects and will be carried out under the supervision of the Secretary General, in collaboration with the relevant FEPS Director and Policy Analysts.

2.3.3. Category 3: Submission of non-committing ideas

This category allows you to submit initial ideas that you would like to see FEPS develop.

Should a project result from debating it, entering into a partnership could be envisaged.

As a consequence, the submission of a non-committing idea doesn't require specifying the list of stakeholders - partners, implementation plan, agenda, means etc.

It however requires the following information:

- The thematic field your idea would fall under
- A working title that refers to your idea
- A short description of your idea and the angle that FEPS should consider
- A short description of what would be an added value and how this corresponds to one or several of the 3 annual priorities
- Suggestion as per what could be the next steps to act on this idea entail

III. HOW – THE CALL IN PRACTICE

3.1. 3 WAYS TO ENGAGE

In accordance to the section 2.3, there are 3 categories for you to consider when planning to engage with FEPS within its Work Plan 2026:

1. Submitting New Project Proposals
2. Expressing Interest in Approved Projects & Programmes
3. Submitting non-committing ideas

Through this platform, you can introduce the details of a concrete project proposal.

The more details are submitted – the greater chances are for FEPS to act as an enabler constructing a consortium of Members with corresponding or converging interests, who could gear a potential project jointly.

The procedure of submitting shall be repeated for the submission of more than one project. There is no cap per Member Foundation when it comes to the number of projects that you are allowed to submit for consideration.

NB: Before submitting one or several project proposals, you must submit basic administrative information via the “organization form” (i.e. Form I).

If you have already filled out this form in the context of previous calls, please double-check the available data and confirm. If not, please complete it.

3.2. PROJECT PROPOSALS' ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Priority will be given to projects aligned to the 2026 FAP in line with the type of activities and areas of interest identified in this call.

FEPS will carry out an assessment of the submitted proposals based on three quality criteria:

1. **Output Value:** the potential of the project to impact public debate and the political process or its educational potential;
2. **Input Value:** the quality of the proposed methods in terms of scientific relevance and excellence of the actors involved
3. **Value for Money:** budgetary and human resources aspects and COMMs context

Furthermore, during the project approval phase, with the intention to promote cross-network collaborations as well as sustainability, relevance, and impact of 2025 activities, FEPS will favor:

- Projects that are submitted jointly by two or more Member foundations
- Projects that promote innovation instead of repetition of pre-existing endeavors
- Projects that deliver materials proving useful for political debates
- Projects that contribute purposefully disseminating research produced in 2023
- Projects that bear the potential of delivering materials which can be used for training purposes
- Projects that bear the potential of engaging with new and/or specific audiences

Besides quality and joint work, FEPS shall take into consideration: i) the allocation of budget per foundation and per country, with no specific annual targets but with the clear goal of providing a balanced approach to FEPS financial commitments; ii) the allocation of budget per thematic block and strategic priority, following an operative target that can ensure the link between political priorities and operations.

3.3. SELECTION PROCEDURE AND THE WAY FORWARD

- Deadline for submissions: 21.11.2025
- Information about results of the call: 19.12.2025

At this occasion, FEPS will clarify whether the submitted project has been:

- ⇒ **Accepted** – so that you can start defining a collaboration agreement with the FEPS team member in charge of the project.
- ⇒ **Accepted with conditions** – which can pertain to the budget, to the content or the format of the project and requires further adaptation including the potential clustering with other similar initiatives and the creation of a consortium of foundations.
- ⇒ **Declined** – a short written explanation will be provided.

The official communication will specify the member of FEPS team that will follow up on the implementation of the project.

If the latter is approved directly or conditionally, the (Senior) Policy Analyst in charge, with the support of the respective supervisor, interacts with the project promoters to work on the development of the project, towards the satisfaction of the conditions or towards building up a cluster of foundations around the project idea.

When the project proposals have been evaluated, a 2026 Work Plan outline will be compiled and submitted to the attention of FEPS' Bureau at the occasion of its meeting scheduled January 2026.

3.4. GENERAL RULES APPLYING TO THIS CALL

3.4.1. Project Proposals' Promoters

- Only FEPS Full and Observer Members can propose project proposals.
- Organisations other than Member foundations can feature as partners of the submitted project, but collaborations with corporations cannot be part of this call
- If two or more Member foundations wish to cooperate on a joint project, just one submission is necessary with the indication of the project manager in charge for all the organisations involved.

3.4.2. Project Proposals' Descriptions

- Projects will be first and foremost assessed on the basis of the submitted form. Project promoters can annex as many documents as deemed adequate, but these will be considered complementary information. Accordingly, once submitting a project proposal, please provide as many information as possible. It is essential that it contains a rather clear identification of:
 - The objectives of the project proposed
 - The type of outputs foreseen (events, publications, videos, etc.)
 - The parties involved (other organisations, stakeholders, policymakers, etc.)
 - The provisional budgetary requirements with an indication of the share that project promoters can cover (in light of increased budgetary pressure, please note that the proposed contribution in cash to FEPS' budget will play a role in the assessment process)
- Among the project deliverables that can be included in the project proposals: policy briefs, policy studies, research, books, training, consultancy, online events, publications, videos, podcasts, infographics, surveys, online public debates.
- Multiannual projects can be considered, accompanied by an indication of annual budgetary needs.
- Projects accepted with conditions (see paragraph on the "Selection Procedure") remain valid for a period of two months, after which FEPS reserves the right to prioritize other submitted projects.

3.4.3. Regulatory impositions

- As all European Political Foundations (EUPFs), FEPS cannot use its budget for any other purpose than for financing its tasks as enshrined in Article 2 of EU Regulation 1141/2014. These are essentially threefold: (1) observe, analyse and contribute to the debate on European public policy issues and on the process of European integration, (2) develop activities linked to the European public policy issues between relevant stakeholders, (3) serve as a framework for national political foundations, academics and other relevant actors to work together at European level.

FEPS is strictly forbidden to transfer funds in the form of grants to its Members. Beyond, FEPS is responsible and held accountable for the respect of related regulatory provisions by its Members.

- All FEPS (co-)funded activities must be genuine FEPS activities, primarily owned by FEPS, clearly primarily branded FEPS.
- They must include a reference to funding received from the European Parliament (including logo) as well as – in case of publications and events – a legal disclaimer discharging the European Parliament for responsibility on views expressed.
- FEPS will proceed with thorough and proactive ex-ante assessment of risks and factor in past practices in its assessment of submitted projects
- FEPS will proactively monitor implementation and check communications
- FEPS has developed guidelines, tools and templates to ease up the process and will develop further ones. Related documents are accessible on the Members' Area of FEPS' website
- In the specific case of recurring larger scale events, FEPS will prefer the format of "FEPS fringe events" embedded in the broader pre-existing programmes. In such a framework, only costs clearly and undoubtedly related to the FEPS fringe events are eligible
- FEPS is strictly forbidden to fund directly other foundations (including its Members). Accordingly: the following expenditures are not eligible in the framework of FEPS' (co-)funded projects:
 - Partners' staff costs (staff being understood as individuals who are benefitting from a working contract with the partner involved and who are on the payroll of said partner)
 - Overheads (e.g. standing infrastructure costs such office rental contract, phone, electricity, water, non-project specific website/s' costs, etc.)
 - Differences in exchange rates (e.g. the exchange rate to be applied is the one valid on the day the invoices were generated)
- FEPS is strictly forbidden to fund directly or indirectly parties, candidates or campaigns. This is a permanently valid rule which applies at any point in time, not only in the framework of European elections. Accordingly:
 - FEPS cannot fund projects which aim at promoting candidates or campaigns
 - FEPS cannot fund campaign related polling

- FEPS is responsible and held accountable for the respect of regulatory provisions pertaining to potential conflict of interest as defined in EU Financial Regulation 2018/1046, article 61. Accordingly:
 - FEPS will proceed with thorough and proactive ex-ante assessment of potential conflicts of interest throughout project proposals
 - Specific attention will be given to operational setups involving service providers (individuals or companies) which are linked to FEPS' Members and reserves the right to reject a proposal involving an objective related risk

3.4.4. Expressions of interest

- Expressions of interest do not commit Member Foundations to any specific budgetary commitment; FEPS Team will discuss project design and budget with project partner and if the interest persists a financial negotiation will follow
